# 3:15-4:25 International Construction Arbitration: Infrastructure Projects with Sovereigns

This session will discuss key issues regarding international construction arbitration and other conflict management options for infrastructure projects with states or state-related entities. Attendees will learn, among other things, dispute resolution options available for international infrastructure projects and will explore the various issues and challenges when those dispute resolution processes involve a sovereign party. The panel will discuss the cultural impact on the arbitration and mediation processes of the interplay between the common law and civil law traditions. The panel also will speak on the potential limitations on the exchange of information arising from parties from civil law jurisdictions, where "discovery" is not common, consistent with international arbitration practice and the ICDR's International Arbitration Rules. Other areas where the international construction arbitration parties' expectations may differ include specific clause provisions, witness examination, experts, written submissions, privilege concerns, emergency relief, early disposition, the use of technology and the allocation of costs. Challenges may also arise when dealing with language and logistical issues, climate change issues, and ADR options to consider to always keep the project moving forward.
